Kearney resident to co-chair Governor's Lecture

Marilyn Hadley of Kearney will co-chair the planning committee for the 15th Annual Governor's Lecture in the Humanities Oct. 14 at the Lied Center for Performing Arts in Lincoln. Lana Flagtwet of Lincoln and Diane Brownell, formerly of Grand Island and now living in Lincoln, join Hadley in chairing the planning committee.

The 2010 lecturer is Christine Todd Whitman, who will speak on "Staying Ahead While Going Green." Presented by the Nebraska Humanities Council and Foundation, the Thompson Forum on World Issues, the University of Nebraska and Union Pacific, the evening lecture is free and open to the public.

Hadley, Flagtwet and Brownell are members of the board of directors of the Nebraska Foundation for the Humanities.

Christine Todd Whitman was administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency from 2001 to 2003 and the first female governor of New Jersey from 1994 to 2001. As governor, Whitman earned bi-partisan praise for her commitment to preserve land as permanent green space. She also was recognized for instituting the nation's most comprehensive beach monitoring system.

As EPA head, she promoted common-sense environmental improvements such as watershed-based water protection policies and redevelopment and reuse of "brownfields," previously contaminated industrial sites. Whitman is president of the Whitman Strategy Group, a consulting firm specializing in energy and environmental issues.
